Through this innovative program, students and citizens can gain a deeper appreciation of our country's history and character through the study and understanding of its art.

Presenters Dr. Ronald Morris, Ball State University history professor, and Tania Said, curator of education, Ball State University Museum of Art, will focus on using art to teach American history and culture, and participants will exchange ideas and develop instructional strategies.
